ENSENADA MEXICO

In Ensenada, Baja California, Mexico, about seventy miles from the San

Diego, California, border you can enjoy a destination that has more than the traditional mariachis and Mexican food. And in addition to the sun, sea, and sand recreational opportunities on the beaches and in the ocean in this resort community, there are fine restaurants with gourmet food, high-end accommodations, winery tours (it is the "Napa Valley" of Mexico), and excellent entertainment. One of the natural wonders, "La Bufadora" or The Blowhole, is found in only two other places in the world.

On my visit in July I was able to hear superb opera singers, listen to flamenco music and see a great flamenco dancer, as well as enjoy a classical quartet and pianists playing all the favorites for background music. One evening at a beautiful 10,000 square foot circular home, Casa de los Siete Patios designed by architect Jean-Loup Bitterlin (and where Bono has stayed and rehearsed), groups of up to 1,000 or smaller can stay overnight or just gather for weddings. anniversaries, or private parties. Each major hotel can set up tents on the lawns with dance floors for special occasions. All the event coordinators speak English and have superb contacts for fantastic florists with gorgeous floral arrays, photographers, caterers, entertainers, and anyone else you may need to make your event special. Even the DJs will supply traditional club music for dancing along with salsa and other Latin music. And naturally, I got up to dance at each meal and had fun when the others joined in.
